We started the week with the second lesson of our Dinosaur Dance. The children enjoyed moving as a Brachiosaurus by stretching up

tall and walking on their tip toes then and working in 2 groups to create a long line around the hall. They



then created spikey shapes with a partner to act like a Stegosaurus. The children moved to the music, swooping around, stomping and even letting out a gigantic ROAR!



The focus of this week is Dinosaur eggs. We have our very own egg in the classroom which we observe each day to check waiting cracking, for patiently for the dinosaur to emerge! The children

have been so excited each day to check on the egg and tell each other what has changed and what they could see. On Tuesday we

began the process of making our very own dinosaur eggs. We started by blowing up

balloons and the worked children



papiermâché their own balloon. We then waited patiently for them to dry before painting their eggs in bright colours making them unique.

The children have worked hard in our morning lessons. In phonics we have covered the sounds 'oo' (long) in moon, 'oo' (short) in book, 'ar' in star and finally 'or' in horn. The children are becoming very confident with their phonics skills and their handwriting has improved dramatically as they carefully focus on the formation of each letter.



In Maths we have been looking at adding one more and identifying one less, and exploring composition of numbers within 5. The children have carefully worked together to pick a number as the whole and then identified 2 smaller numbers that could be used to make the 'whole number'. They have explored this practically using a part-whole model, a dice and numicon. They enjoy singing our number bonds to 5 song each day and

are getting really quick with their instant recall of these



pairs. We have all thoroughly enjoyed our first 2 weeks back at school after the break!
